This song is easier than it looks. It all revolves around the full D7 shape. If you barr the neck fully and then place the middle finger on the A string immediately above it, you have the exact shape for the "hard" chords in this song. Note, the correct formation for each of these has you barring the first 3 strings, but you may as well make the shape easier by simply baring right across the fretboard.
